



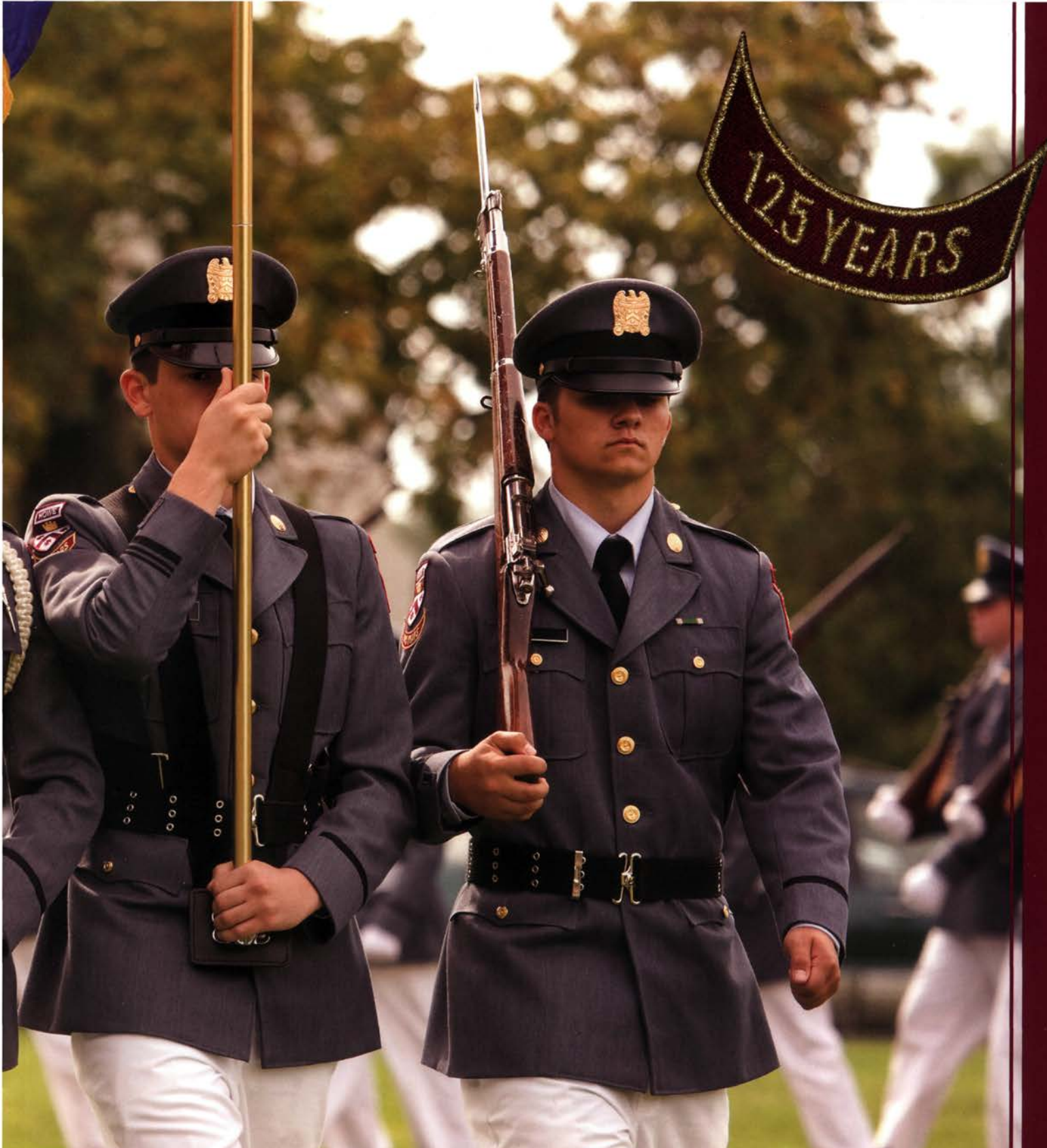



Our military model is effective for teaching self-discipline, organization, and character. Located in Northeast Indiana's Amish country, Howe provides a safe haven for students to eliminate distractions and focus academically. The Howe School's beautiful historic campus is convenient to Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, Indianapolis, and Toledo.

Students that attend The Howe School are intelligent and engaging students who thrive in a structured, focused environment. With an average class size of eight, we provide the individual attention students need to explore their talents and academic potential. Daily scheduled study halls, small class sizes, and a low student-to-teacher ratio contribute to creating a successful school atmosphere. A class period after school may be scheduled for the sole purpose of extra help working one-on-one with the faculty member.

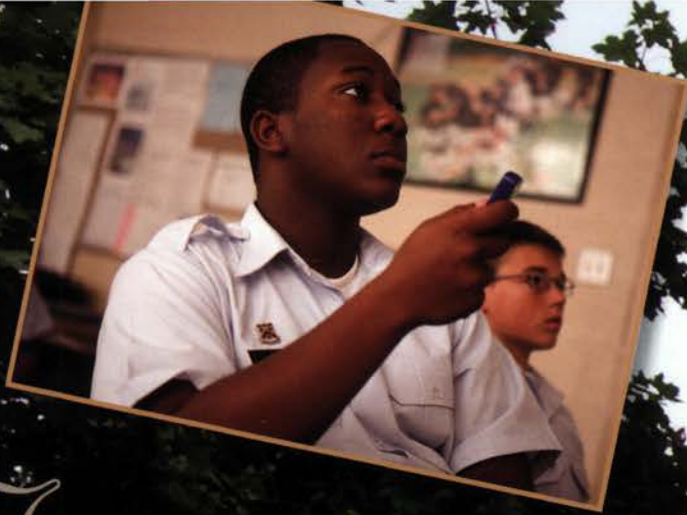

Howe's college-preparatory education encourages academic curiosity and stimulates the sharing of ideas. The scholastic foundation is designed around the balanced sequence of academically rigorous core courses that the Indiana Core 40 curriculum specifies. In conjunction with the curriculum, students will manage a portfolio over the course of their years at The Howe School to aid them in their educational development. 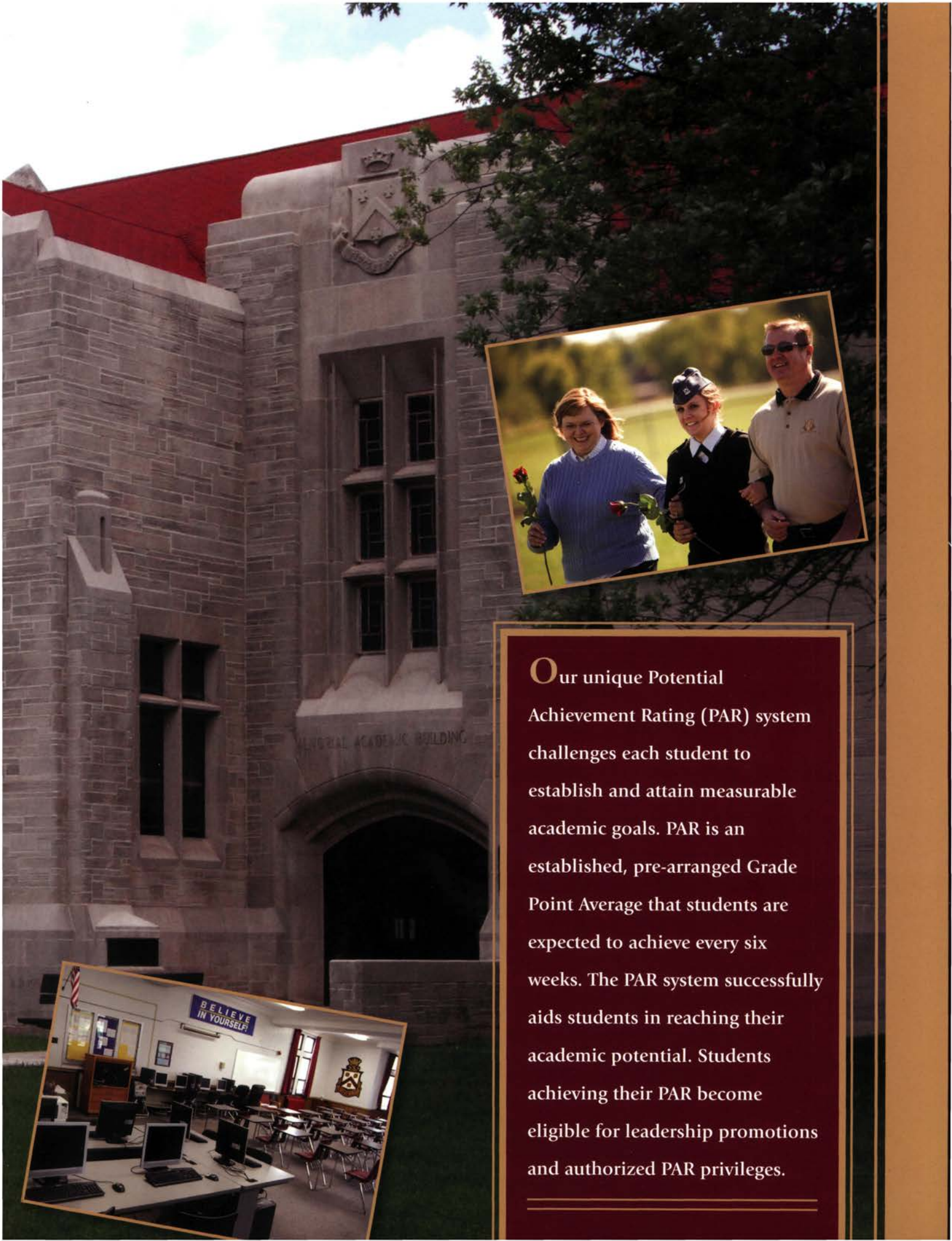
- Science, Technology, Engineering and Math

 - Military Science
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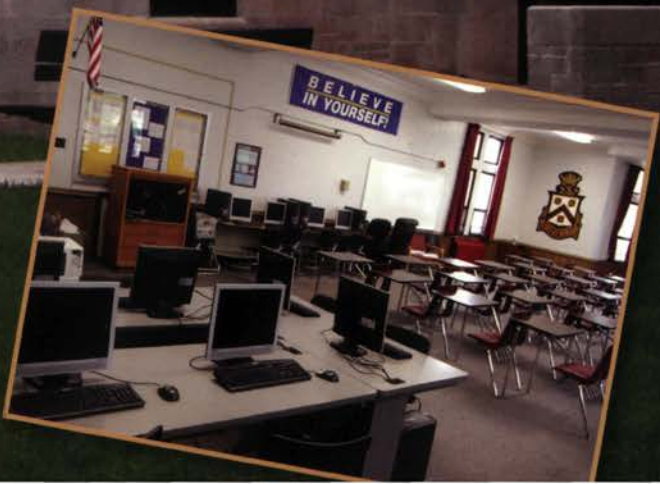
Through exclusive partnerships with Trine University and Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne, Howe offers dual-credit enrollment. The dual-credit program allows students to earn both high school and college credit for some classes simultaneously. The Howe School encourages students to pursue a college education, which we believe is necessary for their success and secure future. Consistently, 97% of Howe graduates continue their education at well respected colleges and universities of their choosing.

Our unique Potential Achievement Rating (PAR) system challenges each student to establish and attain measurable academic goals. PAR is an established, pre-arranged Grade Point Average that students are expected to achieve every six weeks. The PAR system successfully aids students in reaching their academic potential. Students achieving their PAR become eligible for leadership promotions and authorized PAR privileges.



The Howe School is committed to recognizing and respecting differentiated learning styles through its small class sizes and is consistently addressing these styles with effective teaching approaches. Through an effective improvement strategy and plan, Howe partners with families to help identify ways to help every student reach a greater level of academic success and achievement. 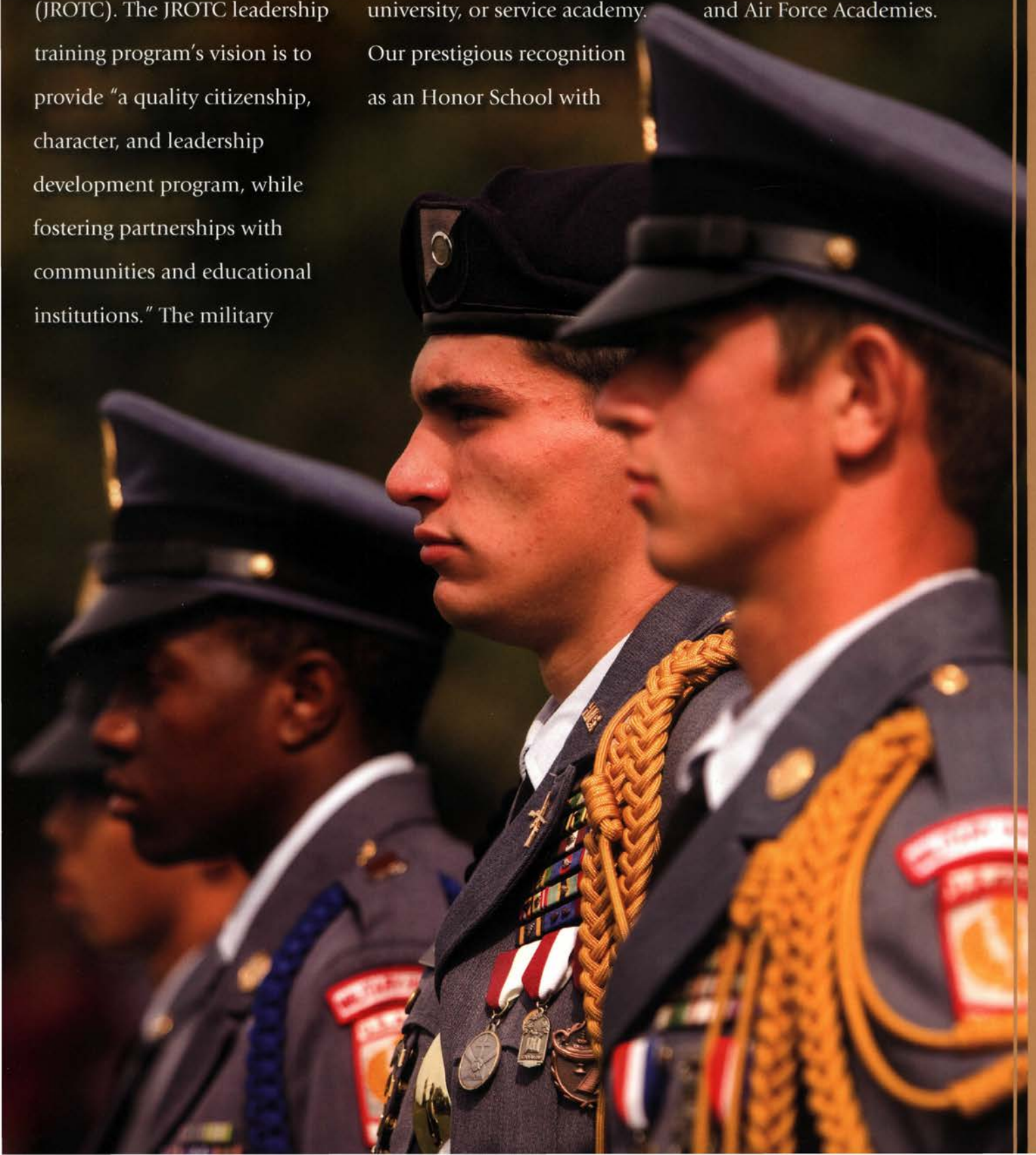




At the core of the Howe experience is the Corps of Cadets. Every student participates in the Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC). The JROTC leadership training program's vision is to provide "a quality citizenship, character, and leadership development program, while fostering partnerships with communities and educational institutions." The military

framework that the cadets live in provides a laboratory for developing global leaders and achieves our goal of sending every student to a college, university, or service academy. Our prestigious recognition as an Honor School with

Distinction allows Howe to nominate worthy students to America's prominent and esteemed military academies such as West Point, Naval and Air Force Academies.





Our cadets live each day by a common code: "I will not lie, steal, or cheat, nor tolerate those who do." Cadets wear military-style uniforms, live in dormitories, and eat in a dining hall. Courtesy, respect for authority, initiative, character, punctuality, and discipline are expected of each cadet. Howe Military Academy Quick Facts

- **Small co-educational, college preparatory boarding school** serving approximately 100 students, grades 7-12. The student to teacher ratio averages 8 to 1. Our campus is located in the peaceful Amish countryside of Northern Indiana.
- **Proud military tradition.** Howe Military Academy is one of the oldest military schools in the country. Our distinctive approach to leadership requires that all students participate in the Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) program by earning rank and contributing in our Leadership and Educational Training (LET) classes. All students are taught fundamental leadership knowledge and character qualities of respect, organization skills, and discipline. Our cadets live by a common military creed: *I will not lie, cheat or steal, nor tolerate those who do.*
- **Small class sizes** that allow true learning and academic curiosity supported through one-on-one instructor interaction. A typical Howe class has approximately 7-10 students where learning in a structured environment is commonplace.
- **Strong support system** for students, with personal counseling available through an off-campus contractor, and faculty and staff that are always available for any help that a cadet might need.
- **Diverse student enrollment** with students representing the countries of Canada, China, Mexico, to name a few. International students make up about 15% of the total corps of cadets.
- **All students are required to participate in athletics** each sport season. Howe believes this is vital to a student's overall experience and leadership development. Howe offers: football, soccer, volleyball, tennis, basketball, rifle and baseball. Physical activity is very important in our cadet's daily routine.
- **Episcopal heritage** that welcomes all faiths. Students attend a brief worship service on Tuesday and a full mass on Sunday. Moral teachings that are central to all faiths and denominations are taught to build character.
- **90% college acceptance rate** for our graduates. Typically, 90% of our graduates go on to a college or university of their choice. Howe does not promote or train students for military service, though we can facilitate enlistment if desired.
- **Honor Unit with Distinction** allows Howe to bypass a congressional nomination for worthy students interested in pursuing acceptance to one of the four prestigious service academies such as: West Point, the Naval Academy, the Air Force Academy and the Merchant Marine Academy.
- **A Financial Aid program** helps make a Howe education more attainable for worthy students who might not otherwise have the opportunity.

*Every student is charged a technology fee; \$335 for grades 9-12; \$235 for grades 7 and 8.

The total cost for a new international student is \$39,000*.

There are four payment plans available:

With the **Early Payment Plan**, the full cost of \$33,000, less a \$500 discount, payable on or before June 1, 2015.

The **Basic Payment Plan** requires full payment of \$33,000 by enrollment day.

A **Deferred Payment Plan** is available, at an added cost of \$400; this requires 60% of the total cost by enrollment day and the remaining 40% due on or before December 1, 2015.

A **Monthly Payment Plan** is available, at an added cost of \$600; this plan's payments begin March 10th, 2015. This plan may be selected during any month, by issuing payments for months missed and continuing installments through December 1, 2015.

The School has a designated amount of scholarship funds available through donations from friends of Howe.

These funds are awarded, once a student has been accepted, on the basis of academic ability and performance, conduct and the family's financial need. Parents wishing to apply for financial assistance should apply online at <http://sss.nais.org>. School Code: 900022

It is understood that once a student is enrolled, he/she will remain for the entire school year or, in cases of late enrollment, for the balance of the school year. The school does not provide health or accident insurance. These should be taken care of by the parents. Medical charges are billed to the student's accounts, but are not part of the estimated expenses. In many cases, a cadet's health insurance may cover assessed medical costs.

We require a \$4,200 deposit, which is an average cadet expense for miscellaneous fees. Total annual expenses (uniforms, books, school supplies, athletic

equipment, special events, field trips, dry cleaning, personal items, etc.) may, in some cases, exceed the \$4,200.

Expenses over the deposit are due as billed at the close of each month.

Transportation to and from a specific major city or the airport during vacation periods and on the Open Weekends is over and above the estimated expenses.

There are some additional charges, according to the student's interests, such as band instrument rental, private music lessons, private tutoring, etc.

School Referral and Sibling Discounts (for 2nd student) are 10% of tuition. U.S. Military Veterans may be eligible for a \$2,000 tuition discount with a DD214 or current I.D.
